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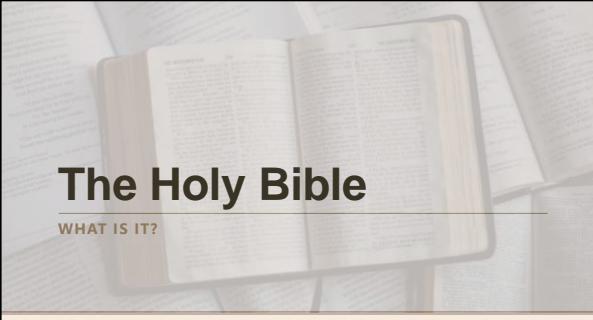
Spiritual Formation

"Thy word is a lamp unto my feet, and a light unto my path."

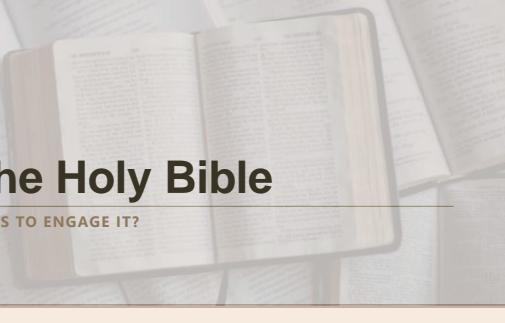
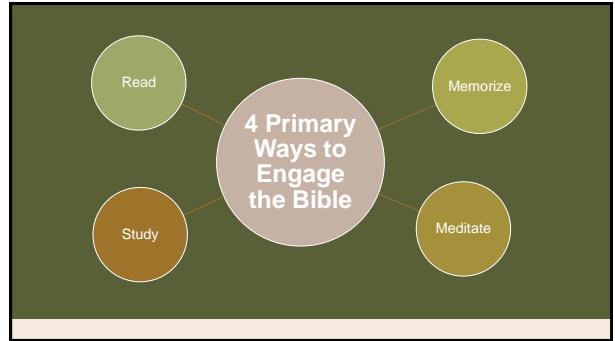


What is the Bible?

- God's revelation of himself.
- *2 Timothy 3:16-17 "All Scripture is inspired by God and is useful to teach us what is true and to make us realize what is wrong in our lives. It corrects us when we are wrong and teaches us to do what is right. God uses it to prepare and equip his people to do every good work." (NLT)*

Bible Meditation

- Hagah: to murmur, by implication to ponder.
- Meditation: lingering in the word until it has left the page, saturated our thinking, and affected our loves and aligned our living.
- To sit with the word as we would a warm fire.



Bible Meditation
